

[TRIUNE] by Wendy Chapman



Triune is a subtle play on threes. It's knit in an open pillar stitch pattern using large needles and worsted weight yarn making it an airy, lightweight spring accessory.

∴ MATERIALS ∴

1 skein Malabrigo Rios [100% Merino; 210yd/192m to 100g/3.5oz].
US size 11 [8 mm] 24" circular needle.
1 stitch marker.
Tapestry needle.

∴ GAUGE ∴

13 sts and 21 rows = 4in/10cm in garter stitch.

Sample used all of one skein of Malabrigo Rios. Please consider this if you are interested in making your FO longer or wider.

∴ ABBREVIATIONS ∴

CO: cast on
sts: stitches
k: knit
p: purl
yo: yarn over
sl: slip one stitch as if to purl
pssso: pass the slipped stitch over
rep: repeat
BO: bind off

∴ FINISHED DIMENSIONS ∴

Laying flat 7in/17.5cm wide and 25in/63.5cm long.

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:: PATTERN DIRECTIONS ::

CO 141 stitches using long tail cast on method. Place stitch marker and join to work in the round. Be careful not to twist your stitches when joining.

Round 1: k to end.

Round 2: p to end.

Round 3: k to end.

Round 4: * yo, sl1, k2, pssso the k2 and off needle; rep from * to end.

Round 5: k to end.

Work Rounds 4 and 5 six [6] times.

Next Round: p to end.

Next Round: k to end.

Work Rounds 4 and 5 six [6] times.

Next Round: p to end.

Next Round: k to end.

Work Rounds 4 and 5 six [6] times.

Next Round: p to end.

Next Round: BO all stitches knitwise.

Weave in ends and block to measurements.
